June 6 breakfast will be a Tullys in Monona. Opens at 8:45. Located on Monona Dr at Broadway.




Great Falls, Montana! Will you be there?

Here are some of the answers to our frequently asked questions:

More people have registered to attend the rally in Great Falls, Montana this summer, than those who planned to attend the rally in Lebanon, Tennessee in 2019 during the same time frame. If anyone thought COVID was going to keep MOA members away from the Rally, think again!

WHAT IS SPECIAL THIS YEAR? Everyone who attends this year will be treated to some first-time events:

-- a First Timers Happy Hour for new (first-time) rally attendees; - so this is the year to bring a new friend!



- -- an electric bicycle demo track where new riders can experience twowheel motion from the driver's seat;
- -- the largest off-road training area ever
- -- and a one-hour closing ceremony!

HOW IS THE CAMPING? A few folks have asked what the camping is like at the rally site, and we've included a few photos to show you how the grounds look. The trees are tall with plenty of grassy camping spaces under the canopy of leaves.

GENERAL INFO:

The elevation in Great Falls is 3,300' - but the higher peaks are a short ride away. The temperatures generally are high's in the mid-70's, and low's near 50 at night, so you might want to pack some wool socks for those nights in the tent.

Glacier National Park is only 3 hours from the rally site. Watch the National Parks web site for updates on road closure announcements. ALSO: Day-use visitors who arrive by private vehicle or motorcycle must have an Entry Reservation Ticket and a current park pass when entering the park through the West and St. Mary Entrances, or via the Camas Road, between 6 am and 5 pm from May 28 to September 6, 2021. Please be prepared to show your reservation confirmation and photo ID at park entrance stations upon arrival. We strongly recommend that you read the website at www.nps.gov/glac for all of the small print.






BMW MOA National Rally in GREAT FALLS

While you are at Great Falls, you might decide to run up to Glacier National Park. Here are some tips for you, including drive-times..

- ODISTANCE Great Falls to St. Mary: 154 miles
- Distance on Going to the Sun Road: 50 miles of stunning vitas and heavy traffic.
- You will need to pay the typical park pass, unless you bought a lifetime pass before they stopped selling them
- You will need to buy (in advance) a \$2 "day-pass" These are limited, to reduce the traffic jams on the highway. You should buy this in advance, because when they max out, there are no more admissions to the road. More information about this in the link below:

2015 Out-West Ride (Jim Harms)

Since Tom is always needing for something for the monthly newsletter, I thought I'd go back and tell you about my ride out west in 2015.

There are highlights from each new state that I visited on two wheels, plus other stuff. My plan was:

- 1. Visit my oldest daughter and her husband in San Francisco
- 2. Add 9 more states to the list states I've ridden on a BMW.
- 3. Attend the BMW MOA Rally in Billings Montana



Kansas

I've always thought it was very flat with nothing to see, but that wasn't the case. In the south, there are tree lined rivers. It started to feel like I was 'Out West' with huge hilly prairies, historical markers and western towns.

The trip was in July and it got extremely hot during the day. After visiting Dodge City's Boot Hill Museum (recommended), I spent the rest of the afternoon in a mall watching a movie in the cool AC.

While taking a break at the Panhandle Railroad Museum in Wellington, I saw a sign that said 'Midway USA'. It was 1,561 miles to both New York and San Francisco. It would take me longer to get to San Fran. There was no set route beyond driving up Highway 1 in California.

My best memory here is driving thru the extremely large cattle stock yards just as the orange sun was breaking the horizon. The sites, smells and sounds are best enjoyed in person.

Colorado

Just hit the closet roads in the far southeastern corner. Still on my bucket list is to return and ride the Million Dollar Highway.

Oklahoma

Nothing memorable in the panhandle part of the state that I did pass thru, except for the Rita Blanca National Grasslands.

Texas

Backtracking a bit, I rode to Texline, a very small town just across the border in northwest corner, where I had true Mexican food at a small restaurant.

New Mexico

Cimarron Canyon State Park, south of Green Mountain, had the first decent elevation changes on the trip. Along highway 64, it's a narrow forested canyon that runs up to Eagles Nest Lake. Speed limit was 25 mph much of the way, which seem to go on forever.

Located in the high country, looking down onto Eagles Nest Lake was just one of those WOW moments! Parked to admire the view and take a few pictures.

Riding along the Rio Grande on State Road 68 was very scenic. Nice sweeping curves which I'm sure that former club member Sam Hokin has ridden many times from his home in Santa Fe.

Arizona

In an effort to make up some time, I basically stayed on I-40 from Albuquerque New Mexico to Bakersfield CA (800 miles) and wasn't disappointed! It's been 25+ years since I've driven thru Arizona in a car. On a motorcycle, the rock formations you ride past are really impressive, even from a distance.



California

First stop was Needles, one of the hottest places on earth, where I got off the bike before 2pm. The temp in the Mojave Desert town that day, July 15th, was 104. Even the pool's water was hot.

To beat the heat, I left the hotel shortly after sunrise with a Camel water pack strapped to my trunk lid and drinking tube to the tank bag. Still, I made frequent stops to douse the long sleeve polyester shirt under my full gear, plus the gator and head cap. It always felt wonderful, but that feeling only lasted for about 20 minutes.

If the city sounds familiar, it's also where Snoopy's cousin, Spike, moved to in the Peanuts comic strip. :)



Bakersfield stuck out for the thousands of acres of fruits and vegetables that I rode by. I was excited to get my first glimpse of the Pacific Ocean at Morro Bay. During the 2010 Redmond Oregon MOA Rally, I was close, but ran out of time and daylight. From here it was up the California Coast on the famous Highway 1.

At Ragged Point, there was an elevated walk way to see the elephant seals. Fun to watch and listen to all the grunting! Next major stop was the amazing Hearst Castle, high on the hill. Shortly after that, I ran into many sports bikes with guys (and gals) in full racing leathers. Chatted with

them for a while. It turns out they were coming back from Laguna Superbike races, north of LA.

A quick tour thru Carmel by the Sea to see the quaint town, Spanish Mission, it's beaches and the famous Pebble Beach golf course.

I arrived at my daughter Kara's apartment shortly after sunset and in proper Midwesterner fashion, we walked down to a local Irish pub for a couple of pints. I average 340 miles per day on the days I was riding, so I was very glad to be off the bike for a couple of days while Kara and her husband Robin showed me the sights of San Francisco and Napa Valley.

Nevada

I'm not much of a gambler, but I did spend the night in Reno. Check out the National Automobile Museum, rated as one of America's Top Five. The retro parts of the town were very cool at night with their old neon signs.

Utah

To beat the heat, I rode longer than usual after dark on I-80, stopping for a walk onto the Bonneville Salt Flats. Spent part of a day in Salt Lake City visiting the Mormon Temple Square and the place where the famous Mormon Tabernacle Choir sings. Amazing acoustics and tour guides. All 9 of the states on my list were now checked off!

Montana

Unlike in Wisconsin, where I can easily go in another direction if there is a storm coming, that isn't an option in Montana. There are few roads and even fewer motels and gas stations, so I stayed on I -15 keeping my eye on one coming from the West.

Big Sky country can be deceiving. I thought I could make if a few more hours before I got to the motel room reserved in Bose, but Mother Nature would have none of that. Before I knew it, the wind and rain was blowing hard, making it a real struggle to stay upright.

Luckily I saw an exit sign for Lima and was able to make it off the road. There wasn't much there but a gas station and small motel. The motel initially told me that they didn't have any rooms available so I asked if I could pitch my tent on their grounds in the pouring rain. Eventually they agreed to put me up in an uncleaned bunk room used by hikers.

It was wonderful to pull into Billings for the MOA Rally, where I ran into other club members, visited the vendors and enjoyed the beer and live music.

While there, I took a day ride to Red Lodge, then up and thru Bear Tooth Pass, which is still as awesome as it was when I rode it on my way to Redmond, Oregon years before. This time I also fit in the Chief Joseph Scenic Highway. Compared to the mountain switchbacks of Bear Tooth, this was very leisurely sweeping curves ride with gorgeous scenery on all sides. I stopped to chat with other fellow BMW riders doing the same loop and remember that one of them didn't have the side case on his RT fully



closed. He was the last rider in their group and no one noticed that it popped open and he lost every in the case. I'll check mine more closely!

I-94

After being gone for so long, I stuck to the Interstate and I didn't make too many stops. One was at the Range Riders Museum in Miles City MT, plus an overnight in the Twin Cities where my other daughter, Amy was going to school. The last day, number 18, was for taking the Great River Road back to Mt. Horeb. As Linda would attest, once I got back, there were quite a few days where I had no desire to get back on the bike.
